



Carolyn B. Taylor

January 11, 1920 - October 30, 2020

Carolyn Beatrice Johnson Taylor, daughter of the late Rufus Hayes Johnson and Lillie Bradsher Johnson, was born on January 11, 1920 in Roxboro, North Carolina. She was the second daughter in a family of seven children. Carolyn was educated in the public school system of Person County, North Carolina where she earned her high school diploma. Upon graduation she attended Stock Beauty College, and after completing her coursework there, Carolyn opened her own beauty shop in Roxboro where she worked with her sister Minnie for eleven years. During this period, Carolyn married Thea Edward Jeffers, and to this union was born her one and only child, her son Willie Edward Jeffers. In the mid-1950s, Carolyn relocated to the City of Baltimore where she found employment with the State of Maryland working as a psychiatric aide. She remained on this job until her retirement, in 1982, after thirty years of service. Shortly after arriving in Baltimore, Carolyn met James H. Taylor, and after a brief courtship they were married. They enjoyed a prosperous and happy union until his death in 1993. Throughout her life, Carolyn was focused on her faith and family. She devoted her time to her husband, and they enjoyed visiting and attending family gatherings in North Carolina and Virginia as well as hosting family events at their home. Carolyn gave special attention to her son and grandson to ensure that they understood the value of education and hard work if they were to succeed in this life. In fact, she insisted on success! She opened her home to several out-of-town young relatives needing a place to stay while furthering their education. Additionally, Carolyn invited her sister Minnie to join her in Baltimore with the support and agreement of her husband James, and Minnie became a permanent part of the Baltimore family. The house was often full of laughter with Carolyn as she cooked for her son's and grandson's friends, and she always served up words of wisdom with the delicious meals. She developed a special bond with her son's friend Ike Brown, who would visit regularly just to check in. Carolyn was a devout Christian. Her religious upbringing was enriched at Union Grove Baptist Church (founded by her maternal grandfather, Rev. Wiley Bradsher) in Hurdle Mills, NC. She also attended First Baptist Church in Roxboro with her parents who were very active members. Her father Rufus served there on the deacon board most of his life. After migrating to Baltimore, Carolyn became a member of New Shiloh Baptist
