



## Edith Carolyn Harrison

August 29, 1941 - March 20, 2019

Edith Carolyn Harrison was born in King and Queen, Virginia, August 29, 1941. She was one of twelve children (eight girls and four boys) born to Bessie and George Frazier. She completed her high school education at Central High School in King and Queen County, Virginia.

Throughout her career she held various positions and supported a range of entities. A few of those positions included private duty nursing, retail, modeling and administrative support. Additionally, as a volunteer, she sang in choirs, provided hospitality to many and held positions of leadership in several churches.

June 1, 1974, she married her husband, friend and partner of 44 years, Lewis Harrison. Together, they traveled during her husband's 21 years of military service to Anchorage, Alaska; Hermitage, Pennsylvania; Nuremberg, Germany and her home state of Virginia. She was faithful in her service to the Lord during her travels and she made it a priority to quickly locate and commit to a place of worship and she could be found serving in one, and at times, two ministry areas in the church.

Over the years, Edith Harrison traveled in several circles and she was loved by many who traveled with her. Her loving and caring personality helped her form many lifelong relationships. She was often referred to as "mom", "auntie", "sister", "nana", "confidant", and "dear friend". It was not uncommon for her to unofficially adopt relatives and friends into the family and she was adopted into the family of others.

She was well known for her many great dishes and desserts but two of her most requested desserts were her infamous Pound Cake and her Banana Split Cake.

She is survived by her loving husband Lewis, her devoted sister Evelyn, her brother Paul (Mary), her devoted daughter Kimberly (Nippsey), her son Tyrone (Sherlene), her granddaughter (Teyana), three grandsons (Timothy, Kristian and Stephan), and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.

The final chapter of Edith Carolyn Harrison's life on earth did not close with the words: "The End" , but rather, at the end of her life are the words: "To Be Continued."
