Deacon John Thomas Bass was born in Hillsboro, N.C. to the late Lewis W. Bass and the late Vergie Torain Bass on December 31, 1936. Following a lengthy illness, he transitioned to eternal rest on April 12, 2019.

John Bass was educated in the Orange County School System, attending and graduating from Central High School, Hillsboro, North Carolina on May 31, 1956. He received several certificates from classes he attended.

John Accepted the Lord at an early age and joined Glenn's Grove Missionary Baptist Church, where he faithfully worked and served the Lord. John moved to Baltimore, Maryland after graduating from high school.
