Julie had an incredible heart to lend a helping hand, whenever and however she could. She was known for her genuine and generous heart; she prayed over everyone and every situation. Julie treated her clients like family.

Motherhood and her career were not the only attributes of Julie; she was the family's chef as well. According to her daughter, Briana, and Julie's nieces and nephews, she was an amazing cook. They loved Julie's cooking, and she, in return, loved cooking for them! Julie relished spending time with her family.

Julie was always ready for an adventure. She loved traveling to international and domestic destinations; she enjoyed learning about cultural nuances wherever she went.
