Louise Mitchell was born on May 4, 1928 in Nyack, New York to James E. Baker and Laura Cherry Baker. She had one older brother, Melvin Baker. She lost her mother at the early age of 10 to cancer while living in Newark, New Jersey with her family. After this loss, she moved back

to Holland, Virginia with her father and brother. Her father, not knowing how to take care of a 10-year old girl, made arrangements for Louise to stay with her aunt in Bertie County.

She struggled after the loss of her mother and was moved around from home to home. She later married William "Pop Willy" Mitchell.
