Wednesday, May 31, 1950, was a beautiful 79 degrees spring day in the City of Baltimore. It was also the day that Reginald Alonzo Pinder entered this world and began his life's journey. Nearly seventy-one years later during the afternoon of Monday, May 17, 2021, and after a short illness, God called Reginald home to Glory.

### A Time to Nurture....

Reginald was the eldest son of the late Emma Pinder Barnes and Alfonso Barnes. Raised in a loving home, Reginald was also blessed with the opportunity to be reared and influenced by his loving grandparents, the late Elenora and Robert Cole. This close-knit family instilled the values that remained at the forefront of his life. Their strong work ethic, sense of family tradition, and his grandmother's culinary skills provided a direction for Reginald and his brothers...the late Melvin Conway, and the late Timothy Barnes. Reginald was nurtured by his grandmother who always instilled the importance of family and church. Her home on Mulberry Street was filled with love. Gillis Memorial was the family's church and where he learned about the goodness of the Lord. As a teen, Reginald was involved with several youth groups at Wayland Baptist and Heritage United Church.

Reginald matriculated through Baltimore's Public School System. His time at City College (Class of 1968), was a rite of passage for him. The friendships he developed there became a lasting part of his life. As adults, they called themselves "The Banditos" – Stanley Lawrence, Champ Gatewood, Kenny Lewis, Perry Winchester, John Lunn, John Gorham, Panglo Freeland, and Mike Smith. Personally for Reginald, this band of brothers later expanded to include Errol Taylor, Robert Mack, Darryl Geigher and Rudy Jackson.

During the late 60's Reginald attended Morgan State College, worked full time at Western Electric, got married and divorced and celebrated the birth of his son, Reginald Pinder, Jr.

#### A Time to Grow.....

During the 1970's Reginald came into his own. A tall, handsome man with an unforgettable swag, he turned heads whenever he entered a room. Reginald was always an avid reader with an impressive command of the English language. He loved the arts, theatre, concerts, and music. He loved all genres of music and even became a disc jockey as a hobby. Reginald's playlist was always in demand and decades later he still composed music for his friends.

In the late 70's Reginald met the love of his life, Sharon Roberson. He loved her unique style, creativity, and shared values. They loved traveling and dancing together. Reginald always remarked about Sharon's special projects. He marveled and complained as to how he got sucked into it. For example, when Sharon started a modeling group, and he became the DJ. She was also a part of the dance troupe and he helped in the set up performances and music selections. Throughout their courtship, they were a united family of three.

#### A Time To Flourish....

During the late 70s, Reginald attended Antioch College. As a student, Reginald excelled and impressed one of his college professors. As such, the professor asked him to consider a career in public service. This offer led to his decision to join the State of Maryland, Department of Juvenile Services where he spent over 35 years.

He cut his teeth in the Community Detention Program for the City of Baltimore. Reginald had a front-row seat in experiencing the evolution of crime committed by youth in the criminal justice system. He had a respected perspective of issues, their cause, and effect. Often Reginald was the center of cocktail conversations on this controversial issue. Upon his retirement in 2017, he was managing the Community Detention Program for Howard County.

#### A Time to Love....

Reginald and Sharon were joined in matrimony on October 3, 1981. During their forty years of marriage, they raised and extended their family, traveled the world and enjoyed each other. Reginald loved socializing. He loved cruising and was always ready to explore new places whether it was in Switzerland, the Mediterranean, Africa, or parts of the Caribbean. He was always known among his friends as the one who could always "negotiate the best deal." Later Reginald became a part of the Phalanx Club. The monthly camaraderie and club's purpose is one he enjoyed.

The Pinder home was always the focal point of gatherings for family and friends. Their parties were legendary. They celebrated holidays, birthdays and for several years hosted their “Last Saturday Party” which jam-packed their home like a night-club.

Together they were a powerful couple and they cared deeply for family and friends.

“My husband is the smartest person I know,” says Sharon. “ He is my protector, biggest cheerleader for all my endeavors, and my very best friend. Intellectually, his common-sense approach made him an incredible source of knowledge and an advisor-in-demand by his friends and family.”

Reginald's role as godfather became a harsh reality with the death of their friend Aletha Mack. Since the age of 6, the Pinders have been the guardians to namesake, Reginald Mack. They played a big role in raising him and have guided all aspects of his life. Reginald has also been an influencer with his goddaughter, Megan Roundtree.

In 2003, the Pinders had a devastating life-changing experience with the death of their son Reginald Jr. Last year, during Reginald's 70th birthday celebration, he gave a moving tribute by thanking Sharon for helping him survive that tragic experience.

Reginald's compassion extended to the love of daughter, Biah. She captured his heart and he was very proud of her excellent accomplishments as a nurse, entrepreneur, wife, and mother. In 2010 and 2012, Reginald's heart was filled with love beyond capacity. The birth of grandchildren Delphina and Zachary added a rich dimension to his life, never felt before. He adored and doted on his grandchildren and could talk about them for hours to anyone who would listen. Affectionately known as “Pop-Pop,” his love for them is immeasurable. His goal was to always create memories, and to teach them to be critical thinkers. Their most endearing time was at breakfast. They would devour Pop-Pop's homemade pancakes. They also loved viewing first-run movies during movie night, and their annual family trips. He was always on the front row of their school programs regardless of when they occurred. He spent the time and poured his love into them.

### A Time to Mourn
