With the help of his brother Allen, Brother was hired by Hilton-Hotel in downtown Washington, D.C. He shined the shoes of the many policy officers, council men and women and business persons staying or passing through the hotel. The ultimate highlight of this career was shining the shoes of President Barack Obama. An occasion which would be featured in the Washington Post.

Brother loved life to the fullest. He enjoyed a good Friday night pinochle-game, family gatherings, and good music. He would be the first and the last on the dance floor. Above all, he was the number 1 fan of his beloved Dallas Cowboys. He really thought 'dem boys' were the best.
