Roxanne met her “Boaz”, Barry Pulliam over 20 years ago and they got married on September 7, 2013 in their home in front of a few family and friends. Of course, Roxanne catered the entire event herself as she wanted to make sure the food was to her liking.

Barry didn't just tell Roxanne he loved her, but he did whatever was necessary to show it. He spoiled Roxanne so terribly that no matter what they were going through, you can best believe that Barry was going to get out of his side of the car and get to the other side to open the door for his precious "Booka".
