She knew more players' names on the Baltimore Orioles than her son Carl. He would tease her and jokingly tell her she was listening to a bunch of losers. Vera was sharp witted and had a keen memory, especially recalling someone's birthdate. Vera will be missed by everyone who knew and loved her. Vera leaves to cherish her memory: her two sons, Vernon Wright and Carl Kess; two daughters, Vernice Gross and Gilda Kess; two sisters, Veronica Ragsdale and Bernadine Williams; brother, Ronald Myers; ten grandchildren, thirty-four great-grandchildren, twenty-nine great-greatgrandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
