In the early sixties, he participated in Baltimore's Civil Rights Movement. He was always adamant about expressing his views. His salesmanship and persuasiveness enabled him to convince the owner of the Lincoln Mercury dealership where he was employed to donate use of Lincoln limos for Dr. Martin Luther King and his entourage for their community events.

Bob had a unique flair for life and special appreciation for living in the moment. Unapologetically, he really did do it "his way." Over the years he had many setbacks and comebacks. A determined individual with a strong will, he was a fighter to the finish. Physically he moved to Atlanta in 1998, but his heart stayed in Baltimore.

His brothers: Norvin, Reginald, Calvin and Sandy; and sisters: Bernice, Thaniel, Doris Minis and Delores Russell all preceded him in death.

He leaves to cherish all the incredible memories to the love of his life and wonderful wife,
