



Rev. Wilbert Sterling McKinley Jr.

August 14, 1959 - April 2, 2020

THE REVEREND WILBERT STERLING McKINLEY, JR, son of the late Archbishop Wilbert S. McKinley and Sarah M. McKinley, was born on August 14th, 1959 in Providence, Rhode Island. He departed this life on Thursday, April 2, 2020 after a lengthy illness.

He received his education at Paul Laurence Dunbar High School in Baltimore, Maryland and attended Washington Bible College in Lanham, Maryland. He was called into the ministry at a young age and ordained in the Church of God In Christ. He began his long career in engineering as a draftsman at M. Rosenblatt & Son, a naval architecture and marine engineering firm. During his long career he would go on to serve as an engineer or project manager at such companies as the Newport News Shipyard, Proctor and Gamble, Mars Inc., General Motors, and Millennium Chemical.

In 2003, he began formulating an after-school nonprofit called The Gospel Lightship which would birth Teach Fleet, a STEM program using elaborate Lego ship replicas to engage youth. Teach Fleet was his ministry and passion. He poured his lifelong fascination with ships and engineering into building a fleet of over 200 replicas with which he toured schools, museums, and libraries throughout the mid-Atlantic region.

He married the former Venus McDowell in 1980 and with her parented three children, Candace, Sterling, and Wilbert III.

Wilbert impacted countless lives through his ministry as a preacher and commodore of the Teach Fleet. He was a devoted husband, father, and friend.

He leaves to mourn: his wife, Venus McKinley; daughter, Candace D. McKinley; sons, Sterling C. McKinley and Wilbert S. McKinley, III; daughter-in-law, Amber McKinley; grandson, Sterling Wilbert McKinley; mother, Sarah M. McKinley; sister, Hope Porter; brother, Marcellus McKinley; four brothers-in-law, three sisters-in-law, nieces, nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends.
