



Abbott Millspaugh

August 14, 1921 - August 13, 2003

Abbott Millspaugh, son of the late Arthur C. Millspaugh, and Mary McDonnell Millspaugh was born August 14, 1921. Abbott spent much of his childhood in Tehran, Persia during the time his father was with the State Department as Economic Advisor there. The family traveled extensively in the Mideast, and spent time in Haiti as well. Abbott returned to Iran as a young man, to assist his father in a later assignment there. After that, he joined the Army, was wounded, and awarded a Purple Heart. After leaving the military, Abbott married Doris H. Rintelmann, and started a family while he pursued and undergraduate education at the University of Chicago. Later, Doris, Abbott, and their daughters, Susan, Judy and Tweefie, relocated to the New York area while Abbott did graduate work in Psychology at the New School for Social Research. He taught at the Nassau Center on Long Island, a private school for autistic and schizophrenic children. Abbott moved to Annapolis, Maryland in the 1960's and then to Baltimore, where he worked briefly at Johns Hopkins University in a psychology research project. Abbott utilized his education, and experience in Middle Eastern affairs doing private consulting work in the Baltimore Washington area until his retirement. He continued to pursue his interest in international relations through studies at Columbia University. Abbott has shared the last ten years with his companion and friend, Joanne Cates, who with Abbott's love and support, just completed her Masters Degree in Clinical Psychology at Loyola College.
