Abraham (Abe) then resided in convalescent facilities, the most recent being the Hartford Gardens Nursing Home where he thrived on the emotional care of his sister, the late Jannie Segars and his youngest sister, Jeanette Sheppard. Abraham leaves to hold dear: four sisters, Juliette Marcus, Jeannette Sheppard, Kathleen Nicoles of Baltimore, Maryland and Naomi Clara of Hartsville, South Carolina; two brothers, Apell and Weldon (Bo-Pete) Alexander of New Jersey; a host of nieces, nephews and other family and friends.
