no one is perfect, few would argue that she was very special. Besides the children, she counted her husband and loving daughter as her chief concerns. The simple joys of life were most important. For years (during spring and summer) she and her husband were well known fixtures at the Inner Harbor. Regular visitors did not fail to notice the beautiful couple sitting in their favorite seat facing the water several nights a week. Her one birth child, Karen was always her motivating joy. In addition, she was for many years the hub for her immediate and extended family members. We will all miss her warm smile and the loving tone of her words of counsel and advice.
