ADDIE (ADA) THOMPSON, beloved daughter of John Banks and Anna Mosley Banks (both deceased), was born on June 10, 1925 in Amelia County, Virginia and departed her earthly home on December 10, 2010.

Ada went on to become one of the founding members of Greater Faith Tabernacle Baptist Church in East Baltimore and gracefully served as "Mother of the Church."

To know her was to love her. She was a friend to all and will be truly missed by


