Adolph William Newton, born July 27, 1925, was the sixth child of Helen and Oscar Newton. He departed this life on September 28, 2003, after a lengthy illness. He was educated in the Baltimore City School System and took business courses at Morgan State University. He advanced his age to join the United States Navy and served from 1943-1948. After an honorable discharge, he went to work in New York as an apartment building superintendent. He later returned to Baltimore and was employed as a Diesel Mechanic Helper at the Coast Guard yard. In 1953, Adolph was employed by General Motors Fisher Body Parts. During his employment, he was promoted to the supervisory staff. He was the first Black to become supervisor in any General Motors plant located in the south. He received the Quality Catalyst Award from General Motors. He also received a community award for providing bus tokens and food coupons to needy residents under the Urban Services Agency. Adolph's hobbies were golf, horse racing and writing. He wrote a book, *Better Than Good*, which was published by the Naval Press. It described his experiences during the integration of the United States Navy. He enjoyed a variety of music, his favorite of all was *That's The Way of the World*, which he always requested to be played at his funeral. In January 1953, Adolph Newton and Ellen Blakely were united in marriage. Of this union, there are five children: three daughters, Carmen, Lee and Norma; two sons, Anthony and Lamont. Adolph leaves to cherish his memory: Ellen, his wife of fifty years; five children; grandchildren, Darnell, Danyelle, Carla, Latoya,

Renea, Ashley, Atlee, Corey, Jasmine Justin, Jason, Jarvis, Tariq, Cole, Jessica, Jermaine and Jachai; great grandchildren, Damar, Shemar, Darius, Kaitlyn, DaJuan, and Sanayah; one brother, Ellsworth (Bunny); one sister, Helen; one daughter-in-law, Alfreda; two sisters-in-law, Thelma and Viola; one brother-in-law, Walter, loving cousins and a host of other relatives and friends.
