Agnes White Ellis, daughter of the late Johnny and Betty White, was born on February 12, 1931 in Prince Edward County, Farmville, Virginia. She departed this life peacefully on January 05, 2019 after a lengthy illness.

Agnes received her early education in the Prince Edward County Public Schools, also attending R.R. Moton High School.

Agnes was brought up in a Christian home. She was baptized at an early age at New Hope Baptist Church in Keysville, VA where she attended Sunday School with her parents and siblings. Upon coming to Baltimore, Maryland in the early 1950's, Agnes lived with her older sister Florence and attended Dunbar Night School. Through a mutual family friend Agnes met her late husband, Isaac Ellis, Jr. They were married on September 01, 1972 and they enjoyed over 30 years of marriage.

Agnes loved to spend quality time with her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She loved to go shopping, talk on the telephone, and cook delicious meals for her family and attend the Early Morning Service and Sunday School at her church.

Agnes was preceded in death by her late parents, Johnny and Betty White, her late husband Isaac Ellis Jr., and her siblings, Minnie, Alberta, Clarence, Florence, Laura, Ernest, and Edith.
