Albert Francis Xavier Curtis, born to Cecelia Regina Harden and Roland Lee Curtis on November 12, 1938 in John Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland. Albert went home to our Lord on June 11, 2015 at 8:00 p.m. at Montefiore Medical Center, Bronx, New York.

Albert attended Baltimore Public Schools. He attended St. Peter Clavers Catholic Church as a child with his sister and grandmother, Mrs. Nellie Harden. He was adored by the nuns.

He has suffered many illnesses from age 6 months to age 7 such as Scarlet Fever, Rheumatic Fever and Diphtheria, practically living at Johns Hopkins Hospital. Albert has been fighting illnesses and heart problems all his life.

Albert and I frequently wrote letters to each other and talked on the phone. He had just gotten out of the hospital a few days before calling me. The last time we talked was the last week of May for an hour remembering our childhood and laughing about silly things we did as children. Then Albert was admitted on June 1st into the hospital for the last time.

My brother made his peace with God. May his soul Rest in Eternal Peace with Our Heavenly Father.

He is survived by: his stepfather, Charles K. Jackson of Baltimore, Maryland; his sister, Cecelia Coronado of North Las Vegas, Nevada; two nephews, Lucio and Carlos Coronado; two nieces, Veronica Coronado Babauta and Monika Coronado Snell; and several great nieces, great nephews and cousins.
