Albert Ellison was born May 15, 1919 in Eastover, South Carolina, to the late Evelina Hall Ellison and Rivers Ellison. Albert departed this life after a lengthy illness at his home, Thursday, April 21, 2005 at 11:15pm. Albert attended public school in Eastover, South Carolina. Albert enlisted at an early age in the United States Army. Albert was a World War II veteran serving his country from 1941 to 1945 with the Battery "C" 870th Anti Air Craft (AW) Battalion. Albert was employed for 37 years as a crane operator with the Bethlehem Steel Company in Sparrows Point, Maryland.
