



## Rev. Albert C. Greene

April 16, 1923 - November 16, 2016

### ALPHA

Before we are born, our lives are well planned ahead by God, Our Father. So was the life of Rev. Albert Clayton Greene, Sr., the youngest of five children, born to the late Rev. Edward C. Greene, Sr. and the late Elsie M. Greene on April 16, 1923. All of his siblings preceded him in death. Rev. Greene departed this life after a long illness on November 16, 2016. Today we celebrate his "Dash", a life well lived between his Alpha and Omega.

### DASH

Rev. Greene received his education at the Paul Laurence Dunbar High School. Music was a gift granted to his family. Following in the tradition of his parents and siblings. Rev. Greene became a professional musician. He was self-taught and could tickle the ivories like no other. In addition to his ability to play piano, he was gifted with the voice of a golden tenor and enjoyed playing and singing. He utilized his gifts to play for many groups and churches throughout the East Coast. He was most proud of his daughters, Edna and Joyce, whom he would take around with him as very young girls and have them to sing while he played for them. The Greene Sisters were formed with him playing for them. The Greene Sisters went on to travel the world, singing for USO Concerts and eventually recording albums. Rev. Greene can be heard singing and playing the song "A Rushing of a Mighty Wind" on the Album, The Greene Sisters Sing. He also formed the Hallelujah Gospel

Singers, who also travelled up and down the East Coast singing God's Gospel. Rev. Greene also played for the Brown Specials, The Dalton Sisters and the District Union #2 Choir. He was also the Minister of Music at Mt. Calvary FWB Church and St. Joseph FWB Church.

As if his musical gift was not enough, God saw fit to choose him to deliver his spoken Word as well. He accepted his call in to the ministry at the age of 17 and became an Ordained Minister of the Gospel at the age of 19. He had a charismatic style of preaching and many younger ministers and his kids often imitated his signature "whoop" sound.

In 1960 he met and married Virginia M. Greene and to this union were added 7 children, Linda, Sherry, Albert, Jr. Julie, Crystal, T. Tyrone who preceded him in death and Dexter. As if there were not already enough kids, Rev. Greene and Virginia decided to become Foster Parents and nurtured and took care of over 100 kids for the Baltimore City Foster Care Program. This resulted in the adoption of Davonta` Greene. Rev. Greene was a well know figure in his community. Through his selfless acts of outreach, he often provided food to families in the community, and always had a kind word for everyone. He continued to preach the Word of God until illness no longer allowed him to do so. His legacy continues on in the lives of his children.

In 1966 Rev. Greene became the Minister at Lodge for March Funeral Home, then located at 928 E. North Avenue. He served in this position for over 40 years. As Minister at Lodge he officiated over 10,000 funeral services. In 1969 Rev. Greene founded and pastored Pleasant Grove FWB Church. In 1976 he moved his pastorship to Paradise Baptist Church. He served as president of the District Union #2 Conference of the Northeast Annual FWB for 14 years. In 1977 he founded Greater Mulberry FWB Church and retired from this church in 1992 turning the reigns over to his late son, Rev. T. Tyrone Greene. After retiring from pastoring, not willing to just set home, he began providing food to those in need. He would load his vehicle up with food and ride around providing food to anyone who had a need. Through the years he has received

many citations from the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City for his service to the community. He also received an Honorary Doctorate. He has impacted many lives through his preaching, singing, counseling, teaching and mentoring, The Bible promises, 3 score and 10. He gave 4 score and 13. Well done thy good and faithful servant. You have lived out your DAS
