He later became the first black truck driver for the company. Sonny met and married the former Alice Jean Martin in 1963, and from this union four children were born: Theresa, Andrea, Allen and Mary. Sonny was a loving and devoted husband, father and friend to all that knew him. Family meant everything to him, especially his grandchildren who brought him great joy. He loved meeting and talking to people, along with dancing; often being called James Brown II. He was a member of the King Cobra CB club of Baltimore, MD where he went by the handle of "Meatman".

He leaves to mourn: a wife, Alice Jean Knight; four children, Theresa Barnes, Andrea Knight, Allen Knight and Mary Knight; one son-in-law, James Barnes; one daughter-in-law, Tara Williams Knight; one sister, Alice Moore; one brother, J.C.
