Alfred Davis, Jr., known to his family and friends as “ROCKY” was born in Wedgefield, South Carolina on September 3, 1920 to the late Lulu and Alfred Davis, Sr. he was the second born In 1922, they moved to Duquesne, Pennsylvania. Rocky was raised in a loving home with his older brother, Abdul Azeez (who preceded him in death).

Rocky attended Duquesne City Schools and after completing his studies he began his career at Bethlehem Steel in Pennsylvania in the early 1940's.
