Within a year of returning to Richmond, he graduated from Maggie L. Walker High School. After high school, he moved to New York where he was eventually employed by American Airlines. During this period in his life, he was able to do what he really enjoyed, which was to travel. He also enjoyed sharing this benefit with our mother. After living in New York for over 25 years, he returned to Richmond where he remained until he was mercifully called to his final resting place.

Everyone who really knew Junnie knew that he was someone who had a very kind heart and was always willing to help anyone anyway he could. He used to give (not sell) his blood on a regular basis to the blood bank, and

also, frequently donated to the "feed the children" program when he was able to do so.

Junnie is survived by his sister, Fredricka H. Davis; brother-in-law, Flunory Davis, Jr.; niece, Cheri L. Bennett; and other relatives and friends.
