



## Alfred Page Liggon

March 18, 1939 - December 20, 2014

On Saturday, December 20, 2014. God called home our beloved Alfred Page Liggon. He was born on March 18, 1939 to Gugertha Liggon and Gus Liggon, Sr. in Amelia County, VA. He was the sixth of nine children born to the union.

During his early years, Al attended Chase City Elementary School and West End High School. After graduating High School he relocated to Philadelphia, PA where he lived for several years prior to joining the United States Army where he served his country. Upon being discharged he resided in New York where he gained employment with the United States Postal Service for many years. While in New York, Al met the love of his life Joan Binns to whom he later married.

After leaving the Postal Service he worked several other jobs until he became a Truck Driver for Home Depot in Elmont, NY. While in NY, he began his Christian walk at Gethsemane Baptist Church under the leadership of his brother, Rev. Garland B. Liggon. Soon after joining the church, Al became a Deacon and served on the board of Trustees. He was also the Sunday School Superintendent and Sunday School Teacher. Upon his relocation to Virginia, Al continued his employment with Home Depot in Chesterfield, VA. where he worked as a full time employee.

Al and Joan became members of Mt. Nebo Baptist Church under the

leadership of Rev. Vincent T. Williams, Sr., where he also served as Sunday School Teacher, Trustee member and Chairman of the Deacon Board until his untimely passing.

Al is survived by his loving and devoted wife, Joan Liggon, loving daughter Ingrid Nelson(Andrew, Sr.); two grandchildren, Alyssa Nelson and Andrew Nelson, Jr., five brothers; Gus Liggon, Jr., (Carol), Fielder Liggon, Rev. Dr. Garland B. Liggon (Patricia), Mallom Liggon, Sr., (Marva) and William Liggon, Sr., (Kathy); two sisters: Bessie Boyd and Viola Terry (Freddie), a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
