When she became a young adult, she went to work at Edgewood Arsenal, during World War 11. After a decline in defense work she journeyed to Baltimore and became employed as a seamstress in a clothing factory. She remained in this vocation until her retirement. She married the late Herman Hagen. They shared many happy years together. Years later she met and married the late Joseph Allen, she loved him and his son very much. She confessed Christ at an early age and was baptized in the family church in Wake Forest. Fayte joined the Fulton Baptist Church in 1939, under the pastorate of the late Benjamin F. Jackson. During and interim of her life, she joined the Mt. Hope Baptist Church. She officially restored her membership with the Fulton Baptist Church on January 15, 1984, under the pastorate of the Reverend Dr. Douglas Wilson.
