Alonzo Steven Williams was born on February 22, 1932 in Baltimore City to Benjamin Williams and Laura Harris Williams. He was the youngest of six children. His brothers were Wilton, Murphy, Hyman and sisters Catherine and Helena, all of whom preceded him in death.

Alonzo, also affectionately known as "Putty", attended Dunbar High School in Baltimore City and immediately upon graduation, enlisted in the U.S. Army and served during the Korean War. He was honorably discharged in 1953.
