She earned her Bachelor of Science degree in nursing from Virginia Commonwealth University and became a Registered Nurse. As an LPN, Alphelia worked at Saint Phillips Hospital and the Medical College of Virginia. As a Registered Nurse, she was a supervisor of nurses at the Richmond Nursing Home. She retired as the Assistant Director of Nurses from the Richmond Nursing in 1994. Ms. Matthews was preceded in death by her parents, her son Tyrone L. Matthews (12/31/04), her sister Katie Friday (6/ 04)

and a great grandson Champ (1/30/05). She left to cherish her memories her daughter, Rev.
