



## Althea M. Breeden-Lee

November 15, 1952 - October 21, 2017

ON November 15, 1952 ALTHEA BREEDEN-LEE was born in Durham, N.C., to the parents of Annetta and Daniel Breeden. Althea was born to serve and be a Cargiver of time, nuturing, love and finances.

On Saturday, October 21, 2017 after a sudden heart attack, the Lord transitioned her from labor to service in the Kingdom .

Althea lived in Baltimore Maryland, was educated in Baltimore City Schools and worked until the age of 62 years old. Her longest employment was with BG&E for over years, before retiring in 2002.

Althea was also known as “Aunt Punchie” and for many years she helped so many with almost any problem or situation that someone found themselves in. Her advice was taken most of the time, Aunt Punchie loved her family, and her family friends. She wanted us to always remember, “Family is all we have... and we must stick together”, “We can talk about our own, but we ain't gonna let nobody else talk about us”. Aunt Punchie loved to cook and often gree to do catering for events. She would cook for all sorts of occasions and affairs. She tried to teach the girls and the boys in the family to be able to take care of themselves. To know how to cook, and clean, to be ready and independent when you have to be. At the age of 59, Aunt Punchie went back to school to get a degree in teaching. She used that education to teach pre-school children

for a while.

Althea joined New Shiloh Baptist Church in 1984, under Rev. Harold A. Carter, Sr. There she continued her ways of being of service to others by joining and working with the Greeter's Ministry of the Church. Twelve years later upon meeting and marrying Charles Lee, joined his church Pleasant Zion Baptist Church under Rev. Dr. James B. Gray. There she served on the Deaconess Ministry, Hospitality and Missionary Ministries. Althea loved to visit the sick, shut-in and seniors. These activities were her favorite things to do. She would often say, "they deserve to have someone come and talk to them, I want someone to care enough to come and talk to them, I want someone to care enough to come and see about me when, and if I reach their age, I only, pay fully, hope, I am missed and loved".

Althea leaves to cherish her memory: husband of 21 years, Charles E. Lee, Sr.; two sons, Anthony Lee (La Tasha) and Charles Lee Jr, (Denise); daughter, Theodasa (Dody) Barnes; four grandchildren, Marqetta, Ebony, Kai, and Trinity; four sisters, Beverly Davis, Sharon Breeden, Phyliss Breeden, and Julie Foster-Dickey (James); six brothers, Daniel Breeden (Tecesia), Michael Breeden (Debbie), Stanley Breeden (Veronica), Alonzo Breeden, Kenneth Breeden and Chris Breeden and Chris Breeden; stepmother, Charlotte Breeden; more than 50 nephews, nieces, great-nephews, great-nieces, a host of aunts, cousins and other family members; two lifelong friends, Shirley Dawkins and Jean Prince.
