Altia’s labor for the Lord began when she accepted Jesus in her life at an early age and she remained a faithful, tithing, member of Christ United Methodist Church until the very end. Altia read her Bible daily. Altia retired as a Key punch Operator for the National Security Agency after 35 years of service. She concurrently worked for the Afro-American Newspaper as a Teletype Operator for 25 years. An avid crossword puzzle buff, Altia said it was a way to keep her mind sharp.
