



## Alvenia Carter

July 15, 1939 - January 11, 2012

On Wednesday, January 11, 2012, ALVENIA B. CARTER, slipped away into eternal rest after a long battle with illness. Alvenia was born on July 15, 1939 to the late Mattie and Robert Benjamin, Sr.

“Mena,” as she was affectionately called by family and friends, loved God with all her heart, and was baptized at Second Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland.
