ALVIN, our brave gentle giant and handsome Hero with the striking hazel green colored eyes, was born on Thursday, July 18, 1946 in Baltimore, MD, to the late Lorraine and Ralph Moore, Sr. Alvin accepted Jesus as his Lord and Savior at a young age; and on October 11, 2024, Alvin stood at attention saluting Jesus who returned the salute, took Alvin by his hand and led him to his Heavenly home where he was lovingly reunited with his beautiful loving wife Bunnie (Valerie Moore).

Alvin received his education in Baltimore City Public Schools attending St. Pius V Catholic School, 1st grade through 8th grade, and Carver Vocational Technical High School where he studied Auto Mechanics 9th grade through 12th grade, where he studied Auto Mechanics and graduated in June 1965. Alvin enlisted in the United States Army in July 1968 and after serving 24 years, he retired in July 1992 as a Reenlistment Career Counselor with the rank of Sergeant First Class. Alvin worked at BGE as Head of Security from 1992 to 1995. In 1995, Alvin went to work at St. Agnes Hospital as Captain of Protective Services where he remained for 15 years until retiring in 2010.

While stationed in White Sands, New Mexico Alvin received orders to go to Vietnam where our Hero served and fought from 1970-1971. In July 1971, God safely returned Alvin from Vietnam and on July 17, 1971 Alvin and Bunnie were happily married. Out of their union 2 children were born: daughter Cappri and son Stephen. While serving in the Army, Alvin's Tours of Duty included Korea, Mexico, Vietnam and Germany (Stuttgart). Alvin's family also had the opportunity to travel the world while being stationed with him in Texas, North Carolina, Germany (Mainz) and Fort Meade, Maryland. The love Alvin and Bunnie shared was evident, they were lifelong best friends, laughed together, ALWAYS had each other's back on this Rollercoaster Ride called LIFE and enjoyed Date Night every Friday. Alvin could be described as a Gentle Giant, who was a man of his word, fighter, fiercely protective, funny, handsome, honest, brave, hardworking, loving, strong, playful, brilliant, dependable, and a man of honor with a huge heart. Alvin was a leader, kind, loyal and faithful provider, husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, brother, uncle, family member and friend who was loved by all.

Alvin will be lovingly remembered for his love of family, his love and faith in Jesus Christ, his impeccable fashion sense, his beautiful hazel green colored eyes, his deep voice, big boisterous laugh, playfulness, huge heart and gratitude, his willingness to listen, encourage, support, offer a helping hand and throwing the BEST cookouts. Alvin loved spending time with and talking to his family and friends, exercising (lifting weights and doing 150 pushups EVERY morning), watching his favorite shows, fishing and dining at his

favorite restaurants and dancing (doing his famous 2 step while snapping his fingers).
