Amanda believed in working hard and playing even harder. She loved deeply, laughed loudly, danced often, and traveled whenever she could. Her favorite color was red—bold, vibrant, and alive—just like her. She adored elephants and butterflies, found peace near water, and left every space brighter than she found it. With her lifelong love of music, family, and fun, Amanda was truly the life of every room she entered.

She was a woman of immense strength, deep soul, and unapologetic self-expression. She taught her daughters that it's okay to be different, to stand strong in who they are, and to set boundaries with grace. She nurtured not only dreams but identities, gifting her family with the rare and enduring comfort of unconditional acceptance.
