Andrew Leon Jackson, son of the late Andrew Jackson and Helen Jackson Jones, was born on May 8, 1924 in Baltimore, Maryland. On the morning of December 1, 2003, God called him home to rest in eternal peace. Andrew was educated in the Baltimore City Public Schools. His military career included service in the United States Army in World War II from 1943-1945, a member of the 197 Port Company and from 1946-1949 in the U.S. Army Enlisted Reserve Corps. For a period of forty-two years, he was a dependable employee of the United States Post Office in Baltimore, Maryland. Following his retirement, Andrew believed in the principle of serving others and engaged in volunteer work at the Veterans Hospital and Bon Secours Health System. Pursuing his personal interests, he held important positions as a full-time member of the American Legion, which he joined in 1978. His recreational activities included gardening, fishing trips and engaging in long walks around Fort McHenry and other locations. Possessing a quiet demeanor and a wry sense of humor, Andrew related easily to all whom he came into contact. As a long-time resident in his community, he was highly respected and he shared his efforts with neighbors to maintain a stable, friendly environment. He leaves to cherish his memory his loving and devoted wife of twenty-seven years, Lucretia A. Jackson. Together they created in their home a warm, hospitable atmosphere, structured upon a strong moral and spiritual foundation. His children whom he embraced with his life, Andrew L. 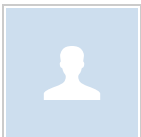
