ANGELINA MARJORIE DANIEL was born in Cunupia in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago to the late Robert and Eliza Oliver on August 17, 1918. She was the eldest of six children. She departed this life on December 18, 2006 after eighty-eight years. Angelina, "home name" Eugenia, was educated in the primary government school system. She worked in Trinidad as a domestic worker. She enjoyed cooking, sewing, crocheting and attending the local women's group. For her cooking skills, she won a national "better village" contest for inventing a breadfruit cake. She immigrated to the United States in 1968. She came to Baltimore and over the years worked for the Blumenthal, Levi, Goldstein, Hurwitz, and Hess families. As she acquired nieces and nephews she became known as "Tanty Eugenia." This affectionate name has been shortened throughout the years to be simply "Tanty." She is lovingly called "Tanty" by those who are not nieces, nephews or even blood relatives. Tanty enjoyed family gatherings, especially at the holidays. She was always delighted to host these events. As Tanty's advanced age and limitations began to take a toll on her life, she was determined to still be an active family member as she continued to enjoy all of the gatherings. On her last full day of life, December 17, 2006, she was the center of attention at the family's annual Christmas gathering given in her honor at the nursing home. Her peaceful demeanor, broad smile and excitement of seeing family and friends were enjoyed by all. She leaves to cherish her memories: her daughters, Marian and Denise; three sisters, Beulah, Sybil and Yvonne; her

grandaughter, Helena; four great-grandchildren, Angelique, Kenrick, Kevin and Tracey; and a host of nephews, nieces, other relatives and friends.
