She was born on August 8, 1935 in Richmond, Virginia to the late Sallie B. Gordon and Welford Overby. She was one of eight siblings. Ann was preceded in death by her sister, Bessie Gordon; two brothers, Charles and Rudolph Gordon. Ann received her formal education in the Richmond Public School System. She attended Moore Street School and Maggie L. Walker High School, where she was a member of the girls’ basketball team. Ann and John J. Gilchrist were united in holy matrimony on March 3, 1952. From that union, they were blessed with their daughter, Gloria Ann. Ann gave her life to Christ during her teenage years and became a member of St. Paul’s Baptist Church, where she was a devoted member of the New Auxiliary Ministry (formerly the Ladies’ Auxiliary Usher Board). She was also a member of the Chancellor Choir. Ann was employed with Philip Morris, U.S.A., where she retired after 30 years. She was a hard and dedicated worker. She was the first African American Inspector at the Commerce Road Manufacturing Center. Ann was also a very active member in the Richmond Auxiliary-American Postal Workers Union. Ann leaves a legacy of love for her family and friends.
