December 18, 1917 - October 25, 2002

On October 25, 2002, Anna Pauline Briscoe, beloved mother of Ronald Samuels, Darlene Briscoe, Timothy Briscoe, Paulette Jones and Deborah Lyle and beloved mother-in-law of Sheila Little, Melvin Lyle and Alvin Jones, was received by her heavenly Father after a lengthy illness. In addition to her children, three loving sisters, Louise Jackson, Joan Dixon and Ernestine White survive Mrs. Briscoe. She is also survived by loving twenty-four grandchildren, twenty-nine great-grandchildren, twenty-three nieces and nephews, a host of grandnieces and nephews, cousins, and an abundance of friends. Her husband, James M. Briscoe preceded her in death. Three brothers and three sisters, Louis, Kermit, William, Mable, Virginia and Marjorie, also preceded her in death. Pauline, as she was affectionately known, was born to Lewis Augustus White and Margaret Anita White (Wilmer) on December 18, 1917 in Abingdon, Maryland. Mason Senior Community where she also presided and served on the Tenant Council.
