Anna Naartie Parker was born on May 18, 1927 to the late Cornwallis and Mary Abbott Jeffers in Roxboro, North Carolina. Anna went to be with her precious Lord after a short illness and her first and only hospitalization on March 4, 2014.

Anna was the second child of five siblings and one step brother. She accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Lawson Chapel Church in North Carolina. The family relocated to Baltimore, Maryland in 1940, where she attended Baltimore City Public Schools. She worked for at Western Electric during the war and later became a domestic worker. Anna joined Faith Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Simon Williamson in April 1946. She later rejoined and was baptized by Reverend Greggory Maddox.

Anna met and married Harold Parker in 1951. she loved to cook for family and friends and her favorite was fried chicken, salmon cakes, corn bread and peach cobbler. She was known to keep he house in meticulous manner. Anna received several citations from the Mayors of Baltimore City for her services to the community. She loved to sing and dance.

Anna was affectionately known as “Aunts & Nana.” she enjoyed gospel music by Rev. James Cleveland. Anna enjoyed being with her nieces and nephews and nurtured them throughout their life; they were her pride and joy.
