She prided herself in supporting her family by working for the federal government for twenty-five and a half years, until she retired, where she made many long term friends. Annette served as an usher at Friendship Baptist Church until her illness prevented her from serving. Annette was best known for her way with words, and infamous for her personalized letters. Her laugh was contagious and she could make a joke of just about anything. In her spare time she enjoyed writing poetry, crocheting beautiful blankets, sewing, baking and cooking, spending time with her loved ones, and preparing delectable meals for her family and friends.
