Everyone was always welcomed at her dinner table anticipating her famous dishes especially her succulent "Grandma Green's Greens". Even in her last moments when her

mind and memory were fading away, she was adamant and determined to get back into her kitchen, shell her nuts, separate her fruit, and add her little touch of love to her famous holiday fruitcake that she annually gifted to all of her children.

As a phenomenal seamstress, she assured that her children were always donned with her unique creations. Martha Stewart had nothing on Annie Green. She was always redesigning, rearranging and redecorating a room in her home. Often times, if her sons took too long to paint a room, lay a floor, or knock down a wall, Annie "The Handy Maiden" was on the job. Just as she planted spiritual seeds in the lives of many, she enjoyed the therapy of planting in her garden, especially with her son Teddy. Also, she took great pleasure in spending quality time and exchanging creative landscaping ideas with her daughters, Josephine and Clarise (Bay). Whenever Annie needed anything, she relied on her angelic daughter Annette.

Annie was a God-fearing woman, possessing and wholeheartedly demonstrating the fruits of the Spirit -- Love, Joy, Peace, Long suffering, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith, Meekness, and Temperance. Annie consistently showed the act of giving and humility. Even while raising her 14 children from South Carolina to Baltimore, there was always room in her Inn. When someone came knocking and was in need of food, shelter or a listening ear, her door was always open. Annie showed that act of selflessness everyday of her life. At one point there were over 20 people peacefully residing in her 3 bedroom, 1 bathroom row home. She revered the Lord and instilled in her children to always put God first. Her favorite passage from the Bible was the 23rd Psalm, which she often quoted and echoed in times of trouble.

Since 1966 Annie was a devoted member of The Historical Mt. Hebron Baptist Church. She adorned herself in fancy hats, sassy attire, and high heel shoes

whenever she attended service. Annie was beautiful both inside and out. A wonderful soul, full of humility, grace, love and integrity.

As Annie rests in Paradise, having achieved the ultimate expression of God's Glory. She will truly be missed and cherished by all her family members and friends who had the privilege of knowing her and experiencing her love.
