“ The following appears on our website, www.nfmidatlantic.org. Annie was a treasured member of the staff of Neurofibromatosis Mid-Atlantic:

It is with the most profound sadness that we report that Annie Harper passed away on February 1, 2015 from complications of Neurofibromatosis. Our first NF Support Advocate, Annie lit up a room with her smile and positive attitude. Her contribution to NF Mid-Atlantic was immeasurable.

Born in Baltimore in 1951, Annie had NF1 and endured 2 dozen brain surgeries to remove tumors. Two years ago she was forced to have one of her eye sockets entirely removed to stem the growth of her recurring optic glioma. Annie never gave in to limitations. When people averted their eyes when seeing her, she took it in stride. When young people stared at her, Annie's first response was to engage them in a discussion about NF.

In her first year at NF Mid-Atlantic, Annie brightened the collective life of over 700 people with NF who had a difficult time traversing their day-to-day. Annie was their port in a storm and freely discussed her disorder and how she coped with the constant attention she needed to pay to her health issues. She was the eyes and ears of NF Mid-Atlantic, and was the primary influence in reinforcing the need to support those who live with NF and don't wish to be alone. Many a call started with: "I need to Ask Annie something".

Annie Harper was loved by many, certainly everyone at NF Mid-Atlantic, but also by her son, grandchildren, nieces, and nephews and particularly by her devoted sister Gwen. Annie is missed by many and her loss is significant.
