Annie Ruth Holt completed her earthly journey on Monday, January 16, 2012 after a lengthy illness. She passed in a manner typical to her life- quiet with dignity.

Born on April 12, 1919 in Lee County, Georgia, Annie was the first child of Leah Simmons and Arthur Carter.

She attended the public schools of Leesburg, Georgia and in 1935 she met the man who would become her husband, Lee Holt. On December 26, 1937 Annie married Lee. God blessed this union with two children, Annie Kathleen and Bettye Yvonne.

Annie and Lee moved to Baltimore in 1945. After working for several employers, Annie continued her education and became a licensed practical nurse, a career she would enjoy for thirty years. Not only did she enjoy giving nursing care, her patients enjoyed her caring and supportive work ethic.

As a young woman, she accepted Christ and was a member of the Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church for a number of years. On September 19, 1965 she joined The Mount Moriah Baptist Church where she attended faithfully until illness began to take its toll. She was a part of the Flower Circle and regularly attended Sunday School. Annie loved her church and its members and always

spoke fondly of her experience there. God was personal for her and she often went out of her way to help neighbors and others in need.

It was nearly impossible to think of Annie without thinking about her green thumb. She could grow anything whether it was flowers, green plants or wonderful vegetables which she would can and freeze.

She especially loved sharing her baked goods with family and friends. Her culinary skills were excellent. Her pies, especially those sweet potato pies, were fabulous; her cakes- coconut cakes, pound cakes, Lady Baltimore cakes- to name a few- were legendary; and those light fluffy rolls were mouth-watering delicious. She could put a spin on a recipe that would make your taste buds dance with delight.

Just as her food could make your taste buds dance with delight, her hats brought ooh's and ah's from the mouths her neighbors and friends. Annie loved designing and wearing beautiful hats, and she wore them well!

Everyone in Annie's family respected her as a pillar, the backbone to call upon in time of need and in time of joy. Her memory will always serve as an example and be lovingly cherished by those of us who continue our earthly journey: her two daughters, Ann K.
