Annie Lee Jones, daughter of the late Roy Dillard and Alice Freeman, was born on January 16, 1921 and was raised by her grandparents Lucy and Walker Freeman, in Stoney Creek, Virginia. She departed this life on May 14, 2004 after a lengthy illness. Annie was educated in the Stoney Creek Public School System.
