She was joined in the courtship of marriage with Simelton Strother for over forty-five years, until his untimely death in early 1999. "Ann Lois," as she was affectionately called as a little girl, was very compassionate, but surely opinionated. Growing up in a religious home, she had a full knowledge of the Lord at an early age. In 1964, she was drawn to a series of tent meetings that were held on the school grounds behind her home. After attending each meeting nightly, she was baptized into the Seventh-Day Adventist faith under the pastorship of Robert L. Willis. Living by the motto in Ecclesiastes 9:10, "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with might...", she became very active in the church and immediately found much to do. She became a faithful member of the Sanctuary Choir, the Treasury Department, Willing Workers, the Kings Daughters and the Deaconess Board. Always very jovial and outspoken, her favorite pastimes included sewing, talking on the phone and watching wrestling. She was a faithful student of the word; always completing her Sabbath School lessons. She leaves to cherish her memory: three children, Denise, Spring and Toren Hart; one daughter-in-law, Bernadette Hart; one brother, Henry Hart Jr.; three brothers who preceded her in death,
