She was reared in a Christian home with loving parents. On Monday, December 2, 2019 God transitioned our beloved Annie Mae from her earthly life to eternal life.

She received her formal education in North Carolina.

Annie Mae was united in marriage to Willie Moody, Jr. on February 16, 1945. From this union seven children were born. Jerry, Peggy, Douglas, Leondras, Brenda Jean, Levon and Judy Renee. In search of a better life the family relocated to Baltimore in the late 1950's. This was not an easy move, but with the help of family the move was successful. After the death of her husband in 1968, many years later she married Billy Warren Williams on April 28, 1982. This was a joyous and happy occasion. To this union was added her granddaughter, Kimberly Stokes and eventually great granddaughter, Lawanak (Kiki) Joseph.

Annie Mae accepted Christ as her Savior at an early age and was baptized into the fellowship of her father's church, Matthew Chapel A.M.E. Zion in North Carolina. In later years she rededicated her life to the Lord Jesus Christ and became a member of Mt. Calvary Star Baptist Church, under the leadership of Pastor Alex Young. She taught Sunday school, sang on the choir, helped with the soup kitchen, member of the missionary ministry and was honored to serve as a deaconess. She was a faithful servant until her health began to fail.

Annie Mae demonstrated strong work ethics to her family and to all who knew her. For many year she worked in the food industry for many companies including Sinai Hospital. She retired from the housekeeping department with the Baltimore City Police Department. After retirement she volunteered with the Ronald McDonald House and was offered a part- time position on the cooking staff. After a few years there she returned to retirement.

Spending time at the Oliver Senior Center was an important part of her retirement. She enjoyed the fellowship, meals, trips and the fun activities. Her favorite past times were solving cross-word puzzles, watching WE wrestling, westerns and talking on the phone with Sweetie. Her favorite snacks were pork skins and popcorn.
