On April 10, 1950, ANTONINETTE was born to Colonel Wilkens and Anna Saunders. She was considered a miracle baby to the family. Considering her sisters, Magnolia and Helen, were twenty-five and twenty-three years older than her respectively. Her nephew John was nine years older than her.
