Ardonia V. Snowden, Daughter of the late William H. and Mary J. Snowden, was born on May 27, 1915 in Baltimore, Maryland. She departed this life on April 29, 2012.

Ardonia completed her education through the Baltimore City Public School System. She graduated from Frederick Douglass High School in 1933. She was employed with the State of Maryland Department of Parks and Recreation. She enjoyed mentoring and leading youth in the community. She was most known for her leadership in the Barrett Institute for adolescent girls, then located in Reisterstown, Maryland. She was often described by the young ladies and staff as prim, proper, stern and some would admit to her being “mean.”

Ardonia was a dedicated member of First United Church of Jesus Christ Apostolic, now Transformation Church of Jesus Christ, led by the late Bishop Monroe Randolph Saunders, Sr. Her devotion to Christ led her to be a very active member often participating in various missionary activities.
