Arthur Alfonso Brown, Sr., AKA "Big Man," was born on July 3, 1945 in Covington, Virginia. He departed his earthly home on August 29, 2014 at McGuire Veterans Hospital. He took his flight home after a brief period of illness. He now rests in the arms of God.

Arthur was educated in the public schools of Covington, Virginia. He was a daunting football player as he dearly loved the game. He was a force to be reckoned with on the field. Following graduation, Arthur joined the US Army and served in the Vietnam War for a 4 year period.
