He was born on February 4, 1931, the youngest of nine children born to the late Carrie and Joseph Campbell in Baltimore, Maryland. On Tuesday, March 11, 2014, he departed this life after a lengthy illness.

Arthur received his education in the Baltimore City Public Schools. At the age of twenty, he entered the United States Army where he served in the Korean War and was honorably discharged. During his service, he received the Purple Heart Award, Combat Infantry Badge, Korean Service Medal with Three Bronze Stars, and a United Nations Service Medal.

On January 26, 1953, he was married to Ernestine Taylor, a marriage that spanned sixty-three years. Out of this union four children were born, Joseph, Arthur Jr., Aaron (deceased), and Anthony.

Arthur was a devoted husband and father. He enjoyed spending time with his wife, sons, grandchildren, and having family gatherings. Arthur and his late brother, Theodore Campbell, would bring the crabs to many family functions. He loved watching western movies and telling stories about life and history. He enjoyed going on vacations, cruises and casino trips with his family and many friends.

Arthur was a member of Saint Edward Roman Catholic Church and a member of The Holy Name Society where he served in numerous capacities.
