Arthur Benjamin Middleton was born on April 11, 1929 in St. Stephens, South Carolina to the late Elijah and Henrietta Middleton. He departed this life on May 18, 2015 after a short illness. Arthur married his loving, devoted wife, Rhodie Brown Middleton and out of that union had three children Louis, Thomas and Barbara.

Arthur was a Korean War Veteran who was honorably discharged in 1952. After marrying and starting his family, he moved to Baltimore, Maryland when it was difficult to find work in the south. He found work at the Patapsco and Back River Railroad as a Trackman. In 1989, Arthur retired from the Railroad.

Arthur kept up with current events, enjoyed walking around the neighborhood and chatting with people. He valued old school traditions, such as shaking hands, good manners, good work ethics and keeping his word. He was well-respected in the neighborhood and his church. He faithfully attended and served at the Concord Baptist Church and enjoyed his fellowship there.

Arthur had strong family values and greatly cared for the welfare of each one, especially when they were in need. He took particular interest in his cherished grandson Louis Jr, who has autism, and taught him to function to the best of his ability. He also dedicated much of his time to support his son Thomas during his illness.

Arthur leaves his loving and devoted wife of 59 years, Rhodie. He was the devoted father to his two sons, Louis, Sr. and Thomas (who just preceded him in death) and one daughter, Barbara. He had two daughter-in-laws, Joyce and Mischelda, and one grandson, Louis, Jr. In addition, he leaves three sisters-in-law, Mary Lee Young , Carrie Lee and Rebecca Brown; two brothers-in-law, James Brown and Cleo Lee. He was especially fond of his nephews and nieces who faithfully kept in touch with him, Edmund Lee Adams, Johnnie Adams, Clarence Adams, James Adams and Patricia Price.
