One major accomplishment was that she had mastered being able to stand in her stander without crying for as long as a half-hour. Ashley also enjoyed school activities and school functions, especially swimming. Ashley was a loving and affectionate child. She had a genuinely warm smile that brightened the hearts of many people that she encountered. She loved music and often sang when she heard the church choir. She loved being around people, and especially liked hearing children laugh and play. Surprising, Ashley would chuckle when she heard children being reprimanded. Caring for Ashley was an exciting and rewarding challenge. There was never a dull moment. This is because Ashley displayed many temperaments. She could be crying inexplicably one moment, and then cooing and smiling the next minute. Although, Ashley was unable to express herself verbally, she did a great job of

expressing her wants and needs in other ways such as cooing, babbling, shrieking, and crying. Visually, she was limited, but amazingly Ashley's eyes seemed focused intently on whoever that was in her presence. Often she was startled by sounds in the distance that others barely noticed. Ashley loved the sun no matter how cold, no matter how windy; the sun on her face always brought a smile. Ashley's ultimate goal was to receive comfort and to be soothed. She achieved complete satisfaction when she was being held, rocked and cuddled. Ashley leaves to cherish her memory, her natural family, Tiffany Faulk-mother, Ruth Faulk-maternal grandmother, and Shontay Faulk-maternal aunt, Nashay Herd, Janera Johnson, and Jakira Johnson- (cousins) The staff members at the "Be Our Guest" group home, three devoted foster parents-Kimberley Coby and Wallace Hayes, Sheila Henderson, Sheila Honeyblue, and a host of friends, teachers, therapists, social workers; and a special friend "Trina McCuller".
